

GSE HONORS GEOMETRY LASSITER HIGH SCHOOL **FALL 2020**

COURSE OVERVIEW: Geometry is the second course in a sequence of three required high school courses designed to ensure career and college readiness. The course represents a discrete study of geometry with correlated statistics applications. This is an advanced academic course designed to meet the needs and challenges of gifted students and high achievers in Cobb County Schools. Students who qualify for gifted services are taught by a gifted-certified teacher every day during the course. Learning is differentiated through in-depth analysis of graphical and algebraic representations of mathematical concepts.

TEXTBOOK: Georgia Analytic Geometry. Holt McDougal, 2014. This book is available in a digital

format in CTLS under the Resources tab.

CALCULATOR: The TI-84 Plus is the recommended calculator required for all subsequent math courses.

> In this course, either the TI-84 Plus or the TI-30XIIS is sufficient on assessments where a calculator is allowed. No other calculator will be allowed, including a TI-36 Pro. TI Multiview, or an electronic device with a "calculator app" for quizzes or tests.

MATERIALS: A dedicated math notebook is highly recommended. Students should have paper,

> graph paper, pencils and pens (2-3 colors), highlighters, colored pencils/markers, glue sticks, and scissors available. Additionally, a compass, protractor, and ruler will be

needed for constructions.

HOMEWORK: Homework will be assigned and checked daily for completion. To receive credit, HW

> must be legible and all work must be shown in order to receive full credit. It is your responsibility to check your homework for accuracy, make corrections, and ask

questions when necessary.

Scheduled quiz dates are listed on the unit calendar. Pop quizzes may be given at the **QUIZZES:**

> teacher's discretion. Missed quizzes may not be made up. Instead, the unit test grade will replace the missing quiz. Students with at least a 90% homework average at the

end of the semester will be entitled to drop their lowest quiz grade.

TESTS: Test dates are listed on the unit calendar. If you are absent the day before a test, you

are still expected to take the test with the rest of the class on test day. If you are present the day before the test, but absent on the day of the test, you should be prepared to take the test on the first day you return to class. It is your responsibility to make arrangements with your teacher to make up a missed test. A test missed due to absence will need to be made up BEFORE the next scheduled test or a grade of zero

will be given.

GRADING: Tests 50%

> Quizzes 20% Homework 10%

Final Exam 20% - all students are required to take the final exam

in advance that you will be absent from class, plan to take assessments prior to your

Live Sessions (Synchronous)	 Be on-line and ready to begin class at the start of your specific class period. Avoid any distractions during our class time (pets, siblings, social media, etc.) Have your mic available to use each day, as all students will be expected to speak Have your video on daily, ensuring your full face is visible and your lighting is appropriate for the entire duration of the class period. 			
Video Sessions (Asynchronous)	 View and take notes from the posted video sessions each afternoon (or as available). The video sessions are REQUIRED as they are the primary lesson for each new concept. 			
Homework	 Homework will be assigned and graded on a daily basis. Homework must be submitted to the appropriate online assignment link by 11:59 pm the day it is assigned. Work submitted after this time will not be graded. Appropriate work is expected to accompany answers. Answers to homework problems will be given in class & posted to CTLS after the due date. Bring all questions and assignments with you to the live work session the next day.
